Ethical Therapy in Health Care Settings

About the Course:

This 4 credit course was developed by the University Graduate School of Social Work for mental health professionals. The course will familiarize professionals with strategies and techniques to “reach outcomes quickly, effectively and demonstrably,” providing a rationale and theory supporting Ethical Therapy, a repertoire of specific intervention and strategies, and case applications to illustrate the use of the interventions.

Social workers participating in this course will receive their certificate of completion in the mail after completing the course evaluation and meeting any other documentation required by their licensing board.

The instructor is Sandra Doe, LCSW, MD. Dr. Doe is on the faculty of the schools of social work at both Tulane and Harvard University. She has over 40 years experience working in medical and mental health settings as a clinician, administrator, teacher, author and consultant. She holds graduate degrees in both social work and health systems management. She is truly a dynamic and inspiring speaker.

Who Should Attend:

This workshop is designed for social workers at all levels of experience and licensure (LCSW, LMSW, LISW-BSW, AAW) to explore or gain a better working knowledge of ethical therapy. Although the workshop title suggests a focus on social work in health care, it provides a wonderful educational experience for social workers working in any field of practice.
